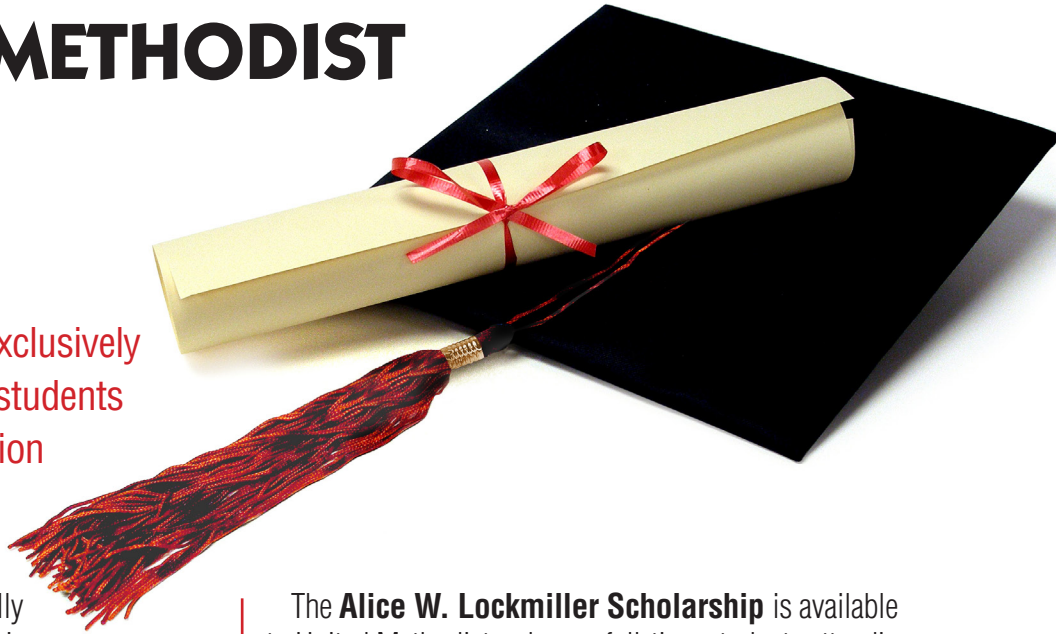


FOUNDATION OFFERS SCHOLARSHIPS FOR UNITED METHODIST STUDENTS

The Florida United Methodist Foundation administers two scholarships that are intended exclusively for the use of United Methodist students who wish to further their education beyond high school.



The **Sinclair Scholarship** is specifically for *incoming freshmen* with strong academic skills and a record of service to church and community. Candidates must be full-time students in the top ten percent of their high school graduating class. They must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher, and be an active member of a United Methodist Church within the geographical boundaries of the Florida Annual Conference. Applicants must be planning to attend a Florida or United Methodist college or university. Applications for the Sinclair Scholarship are accepted between January and March. Applicants may obtain a copy of the application form and scholarship guidelines on the Foundation web site, www.fumf.org. The Sinclair Scholarship has helped nearly 30 United Methodist students obtain a college education since its inception in 2001.

The **Alice W. Lockmiller Scholarship** is available to United Methodists who are full-time students attending a junior college, senior college, university, seminary or other institution for educational or occupational training beyond the high school level. Applicants do not have to be incoming freshmen. Applicants must be a member of a United Methodist Church within the geographical boundaries of the Florida Annual Conference. Special consideration will be given to students who are attending institutions related to the United Methodist Church in Florida. All scholarship applicants must complete a scholarship application packet, which includes an essay, three letters of recommendation and an academic transcript. Applications are accepted between January and March. To obtain an application form and scholarship guidelines, please visit the Foundation website, www.fumf.org.

The Foundation also administers two low-interest student loan programs exclusively for United Methodist students. **The Campbell Trust Student Loan Program** is open to any full-time student attending a junior college, senior college, university or seminary or other institutions for educational or occupational training beyond the high school level.

The Hilburn Prine Student Loan Program is open to students who are pursuing a degree or certificate in a Christian educational field. Applications for fall term loans must be made between July 1 and July 31.

Applications for spring term loans must be made between Nov. 1 and Nov. 30.
